From the Principal's desk

Welcome to the last week of another very busy but successful term. Our Annual Athletics Carnival was held early in the term a team of students successfully competed in District Athletics Competition. The Junior Sports Day was also a very enjoyable day with great participation and sportsmanship displayed by our students. Students performed extremely well at the Gold Coast Griffith University Speech Contest, Opti Minds Competition and Chess tournaments. Our Prep Community Day, Pet Awareness sessions and visit by the Wipe Out Waste Van were very successful school activities. Year 1 Grandparents Day was terrific and well supported and the visit by the Channel Seven Weather team was very informative with many positive comments made about our school and students by our special visitors. J Rock was certainly a fantastic community effort and a highlight of the term. Our "Dream a Better World" Film Festival was also a terrific event and our JRock team provided another wonderful performance during the evening. We received many positive acknowledgements about this year's Film Festival and the comments about the participation, excellent behaviour and courtesy of our students were very pleasing indeed. Our Year 7 students thoroughly enjoyed their week long Camp at Tallebudgera and our Year 5's enjoyed the challenges of their three day camp at Mebbin Springs last week. The term will conclude with our Student of the Term Assemblies and Reward Sessions where we acknowledge the academic performance, effort and behaviour of our students.

Staffing Update

There will be several staff changes in coming weeks as a number of staff take leave entitlements.

- Mrs Priest, one of our Special Education teachers commenced Maternity Leave at the beginning of this week. Mrs Gifford, one of our regular Special Education teachers here at our school, will take over the Mrs Priest's programs and Ms Callahan, another of our Special Education teachers will increase her time here at Coomera to three days a week.
- Mrs King, 4HK's class teacher has also commenced Maternity Leave this week. From the beginning of Term 4, 4HK will be taught by a part time teaching partnership. Mrs Cook, who currently teaches 1DB on a Thursday, will teach the class on Mondays and Tuesdays and a new teacher to our school, Ms Carter will teach the class on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- Ms Ellinor will also commence Maternity Leave at the beginning of Term 4. Mrs Williamson, who has regularly taught classes at our school when teachers have been absent, will teach 1JE for the remainder of the year.

Our sincere thanks go to these teachers for the time and effort they have put into their teaching roles in our school this year. We wish them well as they await the arrival of their new babies.

- Mrs Felton, our Physical Education teacher will be on long service leave for the final week of this term and the first week of Term 4. Mr Franks will replace Mrs Felton for the first week of next term.
- Ms Walker, our Speech Pathologist, will be on leave for the final week of this term and the first week of Term 4 but will not be replaced during this time.
- Ms Arnott, our Behaviour Advisory Teacher will be on leave during the first two weeks of next term also but will not be replaced here at Coomera during her absence.

Ms Way, 5NW's class teacher has recently been appointed as a Literacy/Numeracy Coach and we congratulate her on her appointment to this new position. She will undertake her new role from the beginning of Term 4 until the middle of 2010 providing Literacy and Numeracy support for a number of schools in our District. Ms Walter, who has regularly replaced absent teachers here at our school, will be 5NW's class teacher until the end of the year.

Facilities Update

Arrangements are now being finalised for our federally funded National School Pride Projects which include refurbishment of eight of our classrooms and front entrance upgrade incorporating a new pedestrian path and covered area to replace the existing aged structure. Most of this work is planned for completion during the upcoming September school holidays to minimise disruption to the school. These projects will be further welcome improvements to our school facilities.

Setting up of our new Special Needs building has just about been completed and staff are now utilising these new facilities to implement our programs for our students with disabilities. The building contains two separate teaching spaces, kitchen area for life skills programs, storeroom, activity rooms, teachers' offices and a disabled toilet.

NAPLAN - 2009 National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy test results

In May this year, around one million students across Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participated in the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests for reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

From 14 September 2009, The Queensland Studies Authority, which is responsible for the administration of the NAPLAN tests in Queensland, will begin distributing results to schools across Queensland. Every student who participated in the 2009 NAPLAN test will receive an individual report containing their results. This report provides a range of information about the child's performance on each of the literacy and numeracy tests. It also contains a detailed guide on what was assessed in each test and how to interpret these results. Parents and carers are

Behaviour

Essential to effective learning is a safe, supportive and disciplined environment that respects the following rights.

- The rights of all students to learn
- The rights of teachers to teach
- The rights of all to be safe.

The Departmental Code of School Behaviour defines the responsibilities that all members of the school community are expected to uphold and recognises the significance of appropriate and meaningful relationships. It outlines a consistent standard of behaviour for all state school communities in Queensland, inclusive of students, staff and parents. The Code was developed to deliver the best possible outcomes for students, recognising the close relationship between learning, achievement and behaviour.

School communities use The Code as a basis for providing:

- positive support to promote high standards of achievement and behaviour
- clearly articulated responses and consequences for inappropriate behaviour.

Our school, like other state schools, details particular strategies to promote appropriate behaviour as well as consequences for unacceptable behaviour within its Responsible Behaviour Plan for Students. All schools are currently required to review their Responsible Behaviour Plans for Students in preparation for the beginning of the 2010 school year.

The majority of our students here at Coomera are well behaved and actively participate in our curriculum programs. We are regularly reminded of this by visiting presenters and when our students are involved in off campus activities. Recently, visiting staff from the Wipe Out Waste Van who conducted sessions for classes right across our school, commented that the behaviour and involvement of our students in the program was excellent and that it is one of the very best schools they visit. Students from Years 4 and 6 went on excursions to the Tallebudgera Beach Outdoor Education School last week and again, staff from the Beach School provided the following email commending our students on their behaviour and participation.

"It is with pleasure that I write this e-mail to inform you of the exemplary behaviour displayed by some of your students.

121 year 4 students and 89 year 6 students attended the Tallebudgera Beach Outdoor Education School this week. Both year levels participated in our Olympic Teambuilding Program on different days. The courtesy, respect, encouragement, general common sense and positive outlook displayed by both year levels was outstanding.

We have approximately 7 000 students participate in our Day Programs each year, I would have no hesitation in placing your students in the top 5% of schools who have attended this year.

Please pass on our comments to the students, teachers and parents as you feel appropriate. We look forward to working with your school in the future"

Parent –Teacher Interviews

In line with Education Queensland's reporting requirements, each year we are to offer two opportunities for parent teacher interviews as well as two written student reports. This semester, we are again offering parent teacher interviews towards the end of Term 3 and early Term 4. Written student reports will again be provided at the end of Semester 2. While parents and teachers may communicate regularly throughout the school year, providing information about student progress via interview or written report is beneficial. Teachers have previously advised details of interview arrangements. I encourage all parents to take the opportunity to meet with teachers as this enhances the positive relationship between parents and teachers and helps lay the foundation for ongoing student success.

How many students at Coomera in 2010?

With our current school facilities at capacity, we are already looking towards 2010 and planning for the possibility of a further increase in student enrolments. This may require additional classroom facilities. To assist with this future planning, it is important that we know the approximate number of students who will be attending our school next year. If students will not be returning in the new year (other than our current Year 7 students), please advise the school office as soon as possible. If you know of any families who intend enrolling their children at our school from the beginning of next year, please advise them, also, to contact our school office (Ph: 5519 6333) so that contact details can be recorded in preparation for enrolment interviews later in the year. Your assistance with this would be greatly appreciated.

Prep Enrolments for 2010

We have a very good Prep Program here at Coomera and we are currently accepting enrolments for Prep for 2010. If you are interested in enrolling your child at our school to commence Prep next year, it would be appreciated if you could contact the school office (PH: 5519 6333) to make an appointment for an enrolment interview with a member of our Administration Team.

Prep Enrolments 2010 – Birth dates 1/07/04 – 30/06/05

As stated in the Education Act 2006, the school requires evidence of your child's date of birth. Parents need to bring the child's birth certificate to be sighted and copied by Administration on the day of interview.

Class Allocations for 2010 – Parent Input

While we are only at the end of third term, we need to commence gathering additional information which will be of assistance in organising class groupings for our students in 2010. Therefore, I extend to parents / caregivers the opportunity to submit in writing any information about their child which Administration and staff may need to consider when organising 2010 class placements. Details should be labelled "In Confidence" and forwarded to the Principal by Friday 9 October. This information might focus, for example, on medical conditions, specific learning needs and even friendship groupings. As initial staffing arrangements for the 2010 school year will not be finalised until later in the year, it is inappropriate to suggest / request which teacher should or should not be allocated to your child. All available information will be considered to enable the best possible educational placements for all our students for the coming year.

Keeping safe online

With the school holidays just around the corner, students are busy planning their activities - emailing friends, instant messaging, downloading information from the internet or updating their MySpace profiles.

It's important as parents and carers, that you guide your children in making smart choices about who they speak to and what they access online. By setting some ground rules for internet use, you can help your children to use the internet safely.

- Be involved - spend time exploring the internet with your children and get them to show you their favourite websites, including any social networking sites they use such as MySpace, Facebook or Bebo
- Be open - keep the computer in a room the whole family can access, not in your child's bedroom. If your child changes the screen or turns the computer off when you enter the room, ask them about it.
- Be aware - tell your children to never give out personal information to people they don't know, including their name, home address, phone number or school and to never arrange a face-to-face meeting with someone they have only chatted with online.
- Be cautious - if you believe your child may be at risk, talk to them about the dangers associated with online conversations.
- Be there - remember that the best protection is parental supervision and guidance.

Life Threatening Allergies Alert

At Coomera State School we have several students who have a **life threatening allergy to Peanuts**. The possible consequences for these students, if they come into contact with peanuts in any form, is potential death. Whilst the particular students concerned are aware of their allergy and the safeguards they must follow to ensure their continued good health, it is also important that their peers and members of the school community are aware of the potential risks for these students.

As in all areas of Work Place Health and Safety the school has implemented a Critical Incident Response Policy in regards to the training of staff, storage of medication, tuckshop operations, monitoring procedures and response if an incident occurs. Classroom teachers speak, on a regular basis, about the **need not to share food** and the potential dangers of peanuts to students with this allergy.

Where possible we would appreciate your support in **not sending** your child to school with any foods containing peanuts or traces of peanuts. We are aware that this, at times, can be difficult for parents when making lunches and thank you for your support in this very important matter.
